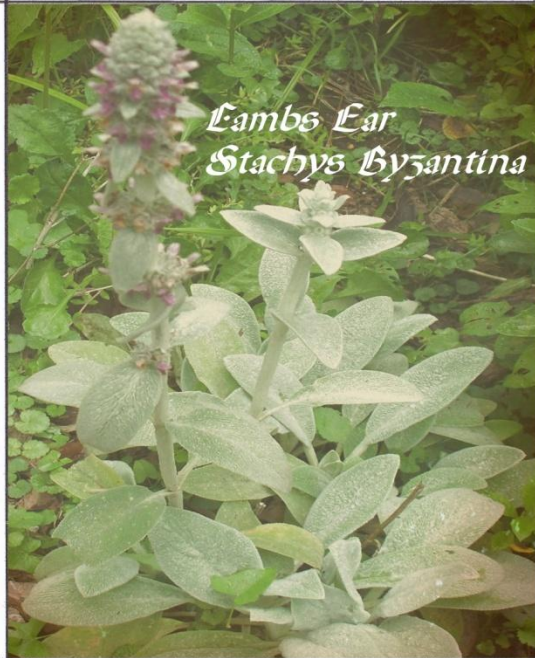

Lamb's Ear  
*Stachys Byzantina*

Also called; Stachy Lanata. Woolly woundwort. Marsh woundwort. Woolly Betony. Silver carpet. Lamb's Tongue. Rabbits ears. Donkey ears. A genus of the Mint family (Lamiaceae)

Location; Can grow in pots. Full sun to part shade. Not fussy with soil as long as it has good drainage (Can rot) Spread mulch under leaves to assist in rot prevention. Drought tolerant. Edges. Between plants and Ground cover.

Sow; 8 to 10 weeks before last frost. Springs Imbolc frost usually goes away 2 weeks into the beginning spring tide.

Seedling emerge; 15 to 30 days depending on temperature

Size; 6 to 18 inches tall and spreads

Flowering; Bealtainne's summer to Eitha's Midsummer

Care; Prune brown leaves and deadhead spent blooms with their spikes

Propagation; Through division root foot from Springs Imbolc to Falls Mabon/Autumnal equinox

Magick; Healing, clearing, purifying, Potpourri. Waters. Potions. Oils. Charms. Wreaths/Garlands. Witch balls. Poppet's. Baggies. Brigit/Early Imbolc. Hellene deities & Nature spirits. Other Beings include Asclepius, Apollo, Artemis, Hygieia, Panacea (Greek) Bona Dea, Febris, Dejovis (Roman) Airmed. Mabonius. Sirona (Celt) Freya, Valkyrie Eir (Norse) Heka, Isis (Egypt)
